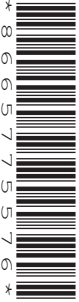

A hundred years ago the idea of space travel seemed impossible – such things only happened in stories. Then in 1969 the first man landed on the moon and fiction became reality. But soon the public will have the same opportunity and will pay for tickets just as they do when they book a seat on an aeroplane, although at much greater expense. This raises a number of questions. Is it right to make a leisure activity out of something so potentially dangerous? We should also think about the environmental risks of taking a holiday outside our own world. In addition, obtaining travel insurance could be very complicated and new laws may be needed for this new situation. On the other hand, one day these journeys may become such a normal part of life that there will be regular timetables and customers will complain if there are any delays.
