The Gumbo Limbo Centre is an NGO and was founded in 1984. It was created through a cooperative project of the City of Boca Raton, the Greater Boca Raton Beach and Park District, Florida Atlantic University and Friends of Gumbo Limbo. Their mission statement is 'To inspire stewardship of coastal and marine ecosystems'.

In 2019 more than 200 000 visitors enjoyed discovering the beach footpaths, counting the tropical fish in the aquariums, relaxing in the butterfly garden and checking on the large number of injured sea turtles in the rehabilitation facility.

The Centre covers large areas of protected land and provides a safe place for many varieties of rare and endangered plants and animals. The preservation of the natural environment has been recognised as a global concern. It is possible to become a member of Friends of Gumbo Limbo and help to increase public awareness of coastal and marine ecosystems and support the educational, conservation and research efforts.

Gumbo Limbo offers:

School Programmes

- Every year more than 5000 school students in coastal and marine ecology visit Gumbo Limbo with their school.

Sea Turtle Conservation

- Monitoring over 1000 nests a year within a large area of beaches.
- Rescue and rehabilitate sea turtles, releasing more than 9000 stranded sea turtle hatchlings each nesting season.

Public Programmes

- Offering a variety of programmes for tourists and local people that are taught by qualified educators, biologists and naturalists.
- Most programmes feature small group sizes and are offered at low cost.
- More than 44 000 people participate annually in the public programmes.

Research and Fundraising

- Florida Atlantic University conducts valuable scientific research in the unique setting offered at Gumbo Limbo. Through this partnership, studies are being conducted on sea turtle behaviour, physiology and ecology. Extra funds are used to help continue this vital research.
